CODES – MYSTERY CODES

• <u>ACTIVITY 1 - Invisible Ink</u>

Using paper and paint brushes get the girls to make own invisible code. Use either the milk or lemon juice and write something onto a piece of plain paper.

When the milk or lemon juice is wet you can read it easily as it is shiny, but when it is dry you can't see it at all.

Heat up the page using the hair dryer, to read the message!

• <u>ACTIVITY 2 - Code sticks</u>

Make a code on a code stick, use a long strip of paper, and a stick or a broomstick.

Wind the strip of paper tightly around the broomstick.


Write a message all the way down the stick (on several lines).

When you unwind the message, no-one can read it unless they have the same stick as you! But if they have the stick, they can read the message just by winding the strip of paper around it again.






• ACTIVITY 3 – Pig Pen



Each letter is represented by the part of the "pigpen" that surrounds it. If it's the second letter in the box, then it has a dot in the middle.

So an A looks like this: \square And a B looks like this: \square

Example:



This is decoded as "GIRL GUIDES IS FUN".

- Ask the girls to write their name in pigpen code
